IBPS Clerk Syllabus

To prepare for the IBPS Clerk 2025 exam, candidates need to familiarize themselves with the syllabus for both the Prelims and Mains exams. The exam assesses several key areas:

- **Reasoning Ability**: Tests logical thinking and problem-solving skills.
- Quantitative Aptitude: Includes mathematical concepts and data analysis.
- English Language: Focuses on reading comprehension, vocabulary, and grammar.
- Computer Aptitude: Covers basic computer knowledge integrated with reasoning.
- **General/Financial Awareness**: Checks knowledge of current affairs, banking, and financial topics (included only in the Mains exam).

The Preliminary exam is objective-based, consisting of three sections: English Language, Reasoning Ability, and Numerical Ability.

Language Proficiency Test (LPT)

Candidates qualifying for the Mains must pass the **Language Proficiency Test** (LPT). This test evaluates skills in the official language of the state applied for.

- Key Areas:
 - Reading comprehension
 - Writing letters/essays
 - Grammar and vocabulary
 - Basic conversational skills

Passing the LPT is mandatory for final selection.
